	1st D/O	In charge of on-scene fire fighting operation.					(3) The Master (officer on duty) may have watch keeping personnel go to check the situation of the scene and fight fire in the initial stage.

(4) When an order is issued to assemble crew members at stations for fire fighting, transceivers should be switched on the channel designated for fire emergencies (refer to above), persons to carry transceivers will secure them and maintain communication on the same channel. The person in command of the commanding team shall check at regular intervals to see if the communication arrangement is maintained in order.
